Foundation Giving at Berkeley

- Private foundations give substantially to UC Berkeley and higher education in general.
 - Last fiscal year, private foundations gave \$111 million at UC Berkeley
 - Average foundation grant is \$300K-\$500K
- The majority of this funding goes to research, with some to student programs/services
 - DO NOT typically fund scholarships, capital, endowments, or chairs.



Foundation Types: Private Foundation

- More than 2/3 of income from a single source
- Must give 5% away annually
- Typically have professional staff and formal guidelines

- Ford Foundation
- Koret Foundation
- Packard Foundation
- Moore Foundation



Foundation Types: Family Foundation

- Legally the same as private foundations
- Distinguished by UDAR as "smaller"
- Typically the original donor and family members are primary decision makers (ie. do not have content expert staff)

- Reva and David Logan Foundation
- Bernard Osher Foundation



Foundation Types: Community Foundation

- Engages in fundraising and grant-making primarily within a defined geographic area
- Can hold donor-advised funds (DAF's)

- East Bay Community Foundation
- Silicon Valley Community Foundation



Foundation Types: Corporate Foundation

- Established by corporations & businesses
- Are legally separate entities

- Amgen Foundation
- Genentech Foundation



Limited Liability Corporation (LEC)

- Not a nonprofit/tax deductible for donor
- Can also give to for-profits or lobbying groups
- No transparency requirements

- Emerson Collective
- Chan-Zuckerberg Initiative
- Arnold Ventures



Case Study: Berkeley Underground Scholars

- Part of the UC Berkeley Centers for Educational Equity and Excellence, or CE3, which helps non-traditional students.
- This program helps provide higher education pathways to formerly incarcerated students





Case Study: Berkeley Underground Scholars

California Wellness Foundation -- We found them -- they have a specific focus on formerly incarcerated youth within their "Resilient Youth" Program Area





Case Study: Berkeley Underground Scholars

Andrew W. Mellon Foundation -- issued an RFP on Future of Higher Learning in Prisons -- BUS met criteria is developing a proposal




